

Set stage for future proposed projects




## Programmatic Approach

- (II)
- Per 23 United States Code (U.S.C.) 139(b)3, FHWA and ADOT using programmatic approach to conduct environmental reviews
  - ► Eliminate repetitive discussions of same issues
  - Focus on actual issues ripe for analyses at each level of review
  - Consistent with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable laws




- 280-mile study area from Nogales to Wickenburg





  - Proposed projects for Phased Implementation Plan


The Tier 1 EIS will provide a roadmap for advancing proposed projects in the future.
